



ADMISSIONS POLICY 2025 – 2026

#### Criteria for Admission to North Brent School 2025 - 2026.

The school has an admission number of 180 for entry in Year 7 in 2025 – 2026.

North Brent School is a highly oversubscribed school. We received over 500+ applications for 60 places in September 2023.

The school will accordingly admit this number of pupils if there are sufficient applications. Where fewer applicants than the published admission number(s) for the relevant year group are received, the Academy Trust will offer places at the school to all those who have applied.

## **Application Process**

The school will operate within the Brent Co-ordination Scheme and Applications for Secondary Transfer should be made using the Common Applications Form. Admissions are centrally administered via <a href="mailto:eadmissions.org.uk">eadmissions.org.uk</a>

### Children with a Statement of Special Educational Needs

If your child has a statement of Special Educational Needs the Local Authority will process your application for a school place as it is their responsibility to arrange SEN provision and consider the suitability of individual schools.

### **Over Subscription Criteria**

When the school is oversubscribed, after the admission of pupils with an Education, Health and Care Plan or a Statement of Special Educational Needs naming the school, priority for admission will be given to those children who meet the criteria set out below, in priority order:

- 1. Looked After Children and children who were previously looked after but immediately after being looked after became subject to adoption, a child arrangements order, or special guardianship order.
- Special medical or social reasons. These reasons must relate to the student and does not apply to family members. Parents applying under this criterion must provide supporting evidence from a professional e.g. a consultant, stating why North Brent School is the most suitable school and the difficulties caused if the child attends another school.
- 3. Children of staff of North Brent School: priority will be given to children of staff in either of the following circumstances:
  - a) where the member of staff has been employed at the school for two or more years at the time at which the application for admission to the school is made: and/or
  - b) the member of staff is recruited to fill a vacant post for which there is a demonstrable skill shortage.
- 4. Siblings of students attending Wembley High Technology College, East Lane Primary School or North Brent School on the date of admission. Siblings means a whole, half or step brother or step sister resident at the same address. In case of twins or brothers or sisters in the same year group where there is only one place available in the school, both will be considered together as one application.
- 5. Distance Measurement (see map Appendix A)
  - 75% of places will be offered to children who live closest to Wembley High Technology College (Zone A): distance will be measured in a straight line from the main entrance of Wembley High Technology College to the main entrance of the child's permanent address (including flats) [using the Local Authority's computerised measuring system], with those living nearest to the College being accorded the highest priority. Where applicants live in the same block of flats, measurements will be taken from the door of each individual.
  - 25% of places will be offered to children who live closest to the permanent site of North Brent School (Zone B): distance will be measured in a straight line from the main entrance of North Brent School to the main entrance of the child's permanent address (including flats) [using the Local Authority's computerised measuring system], with those living nearest to the school being accorded the highest priority. Where applicants live in the same block of flats, measurements will be taken from the door of each individual.

#### Tie-break

Within each criterion (1-4), priority will be given to the applicant who lives closer to the school (in a straight line from the front door of the child's permanent address to the school reception). A random allocator will be used to determine the offer of a place where two or more children are deemed to live the same distance from the school.

### **Appeals**

All applicants refused a place have a right of appeal to an independent appeal panel constituted and operated in accordance with the School Admission Appeals Code.

All appeals for on-time applications for Year 7 will be heard in line with the timeframe which will be displayed on the school website in the Spring Term. Appeals for all other year groups will be heard within 10 days of the appeal being logged.

### Late Applications under the Co-ordinated Admission Scheme

The school will comply with the Local Authority regarding Late Applications as detailed in the Local Authority's School Guide.

## **Waiting List (In-Year Applications)**

North Brent School will operate a waiting list. Where the school receives more applications for places than there are places available, a waiting list will operate and be closed at the end of the academic year. This will be maintained by Wembley Multi-Academy Trust and it will be open to any parent to ask for his or her child's name to be placed on the waiting list, following an unsuccessful application. In-Year Application Forms are available on the school's website.

Children's position on the waiting list will be determined solely in accordance with the oversubscription criteria. Where places become vacant, they will be allocated to children on the waiting list in accordance with the oversubscription criteria. The waiting list will be reordered in accordance with the oversubscription criteria whenever anyone is added to or leaves the waiting list, meaning that a child's position on the waiting list can go down as well as up. The waiting list will be closed each year and will not roll over.

### "Hard to Place" and Excluded Students from Other Schools

The school will work closely with the Local Authority, in accordance with local protocols, regarding students who fall into these categories. Children who are the subject of a direction by a local authority to admit or who are allocated to a school in accordance with an In-Year Fair Access Protocol take precedence over those on a waiting list.

#### Sibling

Sibling refers to brother or sister, half brother or sister, or adopted brother or sister. The child must be living in the same family unit at the same address.

### Twins, Triplet and other children of multiple births

In the event that the school has one place to offer and the next child on the waiting list is one of twins, triplets or other children of multiple births, the policy of the school is not to separate them even if this means that the school will temporarily go over the published admissions number.

## **Split Residency**

If a child's residence is split equally between both parents, then parents will be asked to determine which is the residential address of the purpose of admission to the school. If the residence is not split equally between both parents, then the address used will be the address where the child spends the majority of the school week.

The Board of Trustees reviews this policy on an annual basis.

N.B. Next consultation on the NBS Admissions Policy for admissions in 2026 is planned for Autumn 2024.
